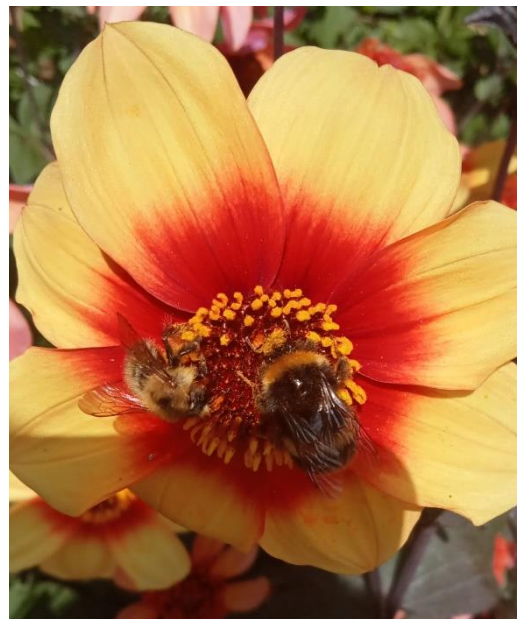

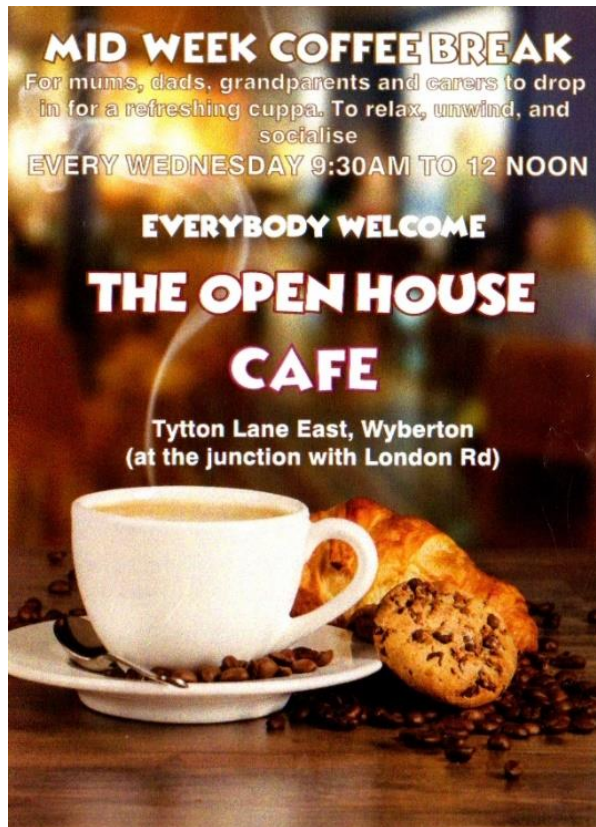

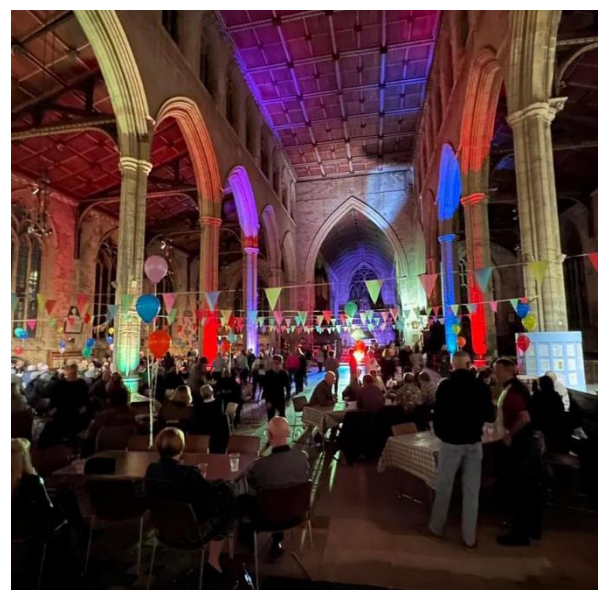


The very popular Friday Night @ the Stump is back, with the disco by Steve Greenhough once more.
